## Re-telling a Story

As you know, we have been working really hard in school and with your support on re-telling and comprehension skills. Shortly your child will have a note in their reading diary if they are one of the children who struggled with this skill and has improved or if they are still struggling. Children with no note in their reading diary by the end of next week are developing these skills at the right pace.

The ability to re-tell a story is a very important part of your child's reading development as it is very easy to read a series of words without actually understanding what they have read or follow the story. Reading is of very little value if your child does not comprehend and enjoy what they have read. Children will only fully develop the love of reading when they can get absorbed in a book.

Sometimes parents get frustrated because they feel that their child's books are too easy for them, however, the teacher will only move the child up a level if they are demonstrating the correct level of comprehension and decoding skills.

### Ideas to help your child re-tell a story

Next time your child has finished reading their book, please ask them to re-tell the story to see how much they have managed to follow. If they cannot recount the story to you, they probably did not understand what they read. By having your child tell you the setting, main characters, and plot of the story in sequence, you can help them. Here are some ideas to help:

- If they are struggling to re-tell the story, ask your child to use the pictures to help them and gradually cover the pictures.
- You could read a story to them and ask them to re-tell it to you.
- They could read a book to you and then you re-tell the story to them, showing them the main points and the kind of answers you are looking for.
- You can re-tell the story and miss bits out, then they have to tell you the missing bits.
- Re-telling skills can also be developed after watching a short cartoon or even after a day out. Just ask your child to tell you what they have remembered.
